Easter Sunday has passed, but the joy and hope of Easter remains with us! The 50 days after Easter are known as the Easter Season and we continue to focus on the resurrection of Jesus. During this time the rallying cry continues to be

Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

The Ascension of our Lord - when Christ promised the disciples that the Holy Spirit would be coming upon them so they could continue doing God's work, and then His ascension to take his place at God's right hand - occurs 40 days into the Easter Season. This year Thursday, May 9 is Ascension Day.

The Easter Season ends with Pentecost which falls on May 19 this year. Pentecost celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, as Jesus promised his disciples, on our hearts and the hearts of the entire community of believers as we are empowered and guided by the Spirit to bear witness and share the truth and fullness of God's word with the world.





An Update on the Parsonage

The parsonage has been empty for 10 months, but still has expenses such as utilities and taxes since it has lost its tax-exempt status without a pastor actually living in it. The first tax bill will be the city taxes which come due August 5. The interior of the parsonage has been painted in readiness for a new pastor, but in the interim until we have a new pastor

to call, the council would like to rent the house using the services of a property management company. Checking with several management companies showed that 10% of the monthly income is the most common cost, although at least one charges 12%. They do tenant screening, showings, contract signing, rental collections and handle day-to-day matters. Renting would provide a source of income for paying taxes and perhaps doing some other updates on the church properties. It would remove some of the burden placed on our property committee chairperson and remove concerns about squatters getting into the house.

At a Special Congregational Meeting held March 24, the Church Council was given approval to proceed with renting the parsonage using the North Star Property Management Company which charges 10%. North Star suggests rent of \$1,800 to \$2,000 per month and has given some recommendations including installing smoke and carbon dioxide detectors; power washing the exterior, and painting the front door. When we complete the recommendations, they will take photos and list the house for rent.

Concordia's Organ

Last spring when Jason Comet became our Music Director, he tested our organ to see how it played. Unfortunately, it didn't. As a skilled, professional organ specialist, he checked it over and diagnosed it as needing repairs and parts. Unfortunately, due to its age, the needed parts were no longer available. He generously decided to loan us, for a year, an organ which he owned. Kathy Robertson, chairperson of the worship and music committee, wished that we could purchase an organ. After her husband, Jim Scott, passed away unexpectedly in August, Kathy offered to purchase an organ for Concordia in memory of Jim. Her offer was appreciatively accepted by the church council. The organ was ordered and arrived March 25. The next step is to do some construction in the attic and in the sacristies in the front of the church for the speakers. Then the organ and speakers will be installed and the "loaner" organ returned to Jason. When it is all completed, we plan to have a service dedicating and blessing the organ. If you attended the Easter worship service, you have seen the new organ in person, but if not, you might enjoy seeing these photos. Watch for further developments in April!
